Aims of the EFG

- To develop new research paradigms that can advance research in the area of instructional feedback, through bringing together a network of researchers in education, psychology, and cognitive science, to encourage the cross-fertilisation of ideas from different domains of inquiry.
- To conduct pilot studies and share data drawn from these new research paradigms in order to underpin future research and provide initial description of the affective, cognitive, and behavioural mechanisms governing effective feedback processing.

What do you want to get from the EFG?



- Deeper understanding of actual effective data collection and analysis leading to robust findings about how feedback works.
- Building international collaborations towards researching important issues related to feedback and learning.
- Joint projects and publications.
- Share knowledge and build collaborations
- Diverse approaches, methods and perspectives presented by researchers from different labs, which will help get a better insight into the nature of feedback/feedback effectiveness
- Further my understanding of the role that self-regulated learning strategies play in successfully utilising feedback and putting it into action
- intensive collaboration with colleagues who are interested in a broad range of feedback-research; new research ideas; creative output (at best development of ideas outside the "mainstream research" in this field and working on creative research projects)

What do you want to get from the EFG?

- I am looking forward to collaborating with excellent researchers, exchange ideas and craft future projects
- Networking, exchange of ideas, explore the potential for grant proposals
- I would like to get from the membership inspiring new views on how feedback may impact feedback processing, with a focus on individual differences, leading to theory building.
- I hope to get to know new people active in the feedback field and to get involved in (or at least: learn about) other approaches of feedback research. Additionally, I hope to learn from the other group members, for example how international meetings and collaborations like these work in practice.
- I would be very interested to cooperate with other researchers who study feedback from different perspectives.
- We hope to meet other researchers working on feedback processing and discover their work. We also should like to collaborate on special issues and edited books and share and discuss research design and methods within the area of instructional feedback. We are eager to receive ideas and advices on this.


